WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

Family and friends of a person missing more than a month

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- This is a FREE event for the public
- Enter information into the *National Missing & Unidentified Persons System (NamUs)*
- Provide DNA samples
- Connect with other families and counselors
- You may also report family members missing more than one month if not done previously

WHAT TO BRING:

- ID photos of the missing person
- X-rays, dental records, medical records and other identifying documents
- Attendance by two biologically related family members of the missing person to provide DNA samples (cheek swabs)
- Police reports
